DEGREE OPTIONS

The Interior Design Program has three degree options...

- Associate of Applied Science (6-semester)
- Certificate (2-semester)
- Certificate + AS Degree (4-semester)

Associate of Applied Science

- This is a professional degree that prepares students for the practice of interior design through instruction in design, space planning, drawing and business.
- Completion of this degree will meet the educational requirements to complete the NCIDQ (National Council for Interior Design Qualification) Exam and the LEED, Green Associate (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design, Green Associate) Exam.
- AAS graduates will be prepared for entry-level interior designer positions in architectural, commercial furniture and interior design firms
- Students in the AAS program must earn B- or higher in all ID courses.

Certificate

- The certificate introduces students to the basics of interior decorating.
- Completion of this degree will prepare students for entry-level positions in furniture stores as staff designers, home staging, or as sales reps in floor/wall covering, or textiles firms.
- This degree does not prepare students to work in design firms as interior designers.
- International students cannot complete the certificate only. They must enroll in the AAS degree or the AS degree + certificate.
- Students in the certificate program must earn C- or higher in all ID courses.

Certificate + AS Degree

- This option pairs the certificate with additional general education courses.
- It is for students who want to transfer to a different school to complete a bachelor's degree.
- Note: we do not have transfer agreements for the ID certificate with other ID programs.

ADVISING & INSTRUCTION

Academic Advising

All full-time students should follow the program advising sequence to stay on track to complete the program in 6 semesters. If you are not attending full-time, or you choose not to follow the advising sequence, please meet with your advisor to create a custom course sequencing plan.

Students in the AAS or Certificate degrees who don't earn a minimum of a B- or C- respectively, will need to retake those courses.

Faculty Availability

Most instructors are part-time faculty with no regular office hours in college. It is crucial that you attend class to not miss important information as it may be difficult to reach instructors at other times.

Most instructors work full-time in the field of design and have strenuous work schedules which they must maintain. Therefore, some classes may be offered in the evenings.

COMPUTER REQUIREMENTS

Hardware

Students are required to have their own laptop. Requirements as follows...

Hard Disk:	10,000+ RPM or SSD Enough space to store and run everything 30GB free space required for Revit to run
Connections:	Need HDMI port or an adapter
Mouse:	With right/left click and scrolling wheel

Note: Mac computers are not recommended. If you have one, you must know how to run Windows on it. Revit will only run on Windows and is very power hungry. No instruction can be offered on technical problems with running Windows/Revit on Mac computers.











There is a sample library located on the 8th floor in room 803/804. This is a resource for you to use throughout your time at Ensign College.






